Qualification Overview

NCC Education's Pre-Master's in Business is designed to enable candidates to efficiently bridge the gap between their existing qualifications and a master's qualification.

This Pre-Master's programme is designed to prepare international students fully for postgraduate level study.

Entry Requirements

1. A non-honours degree

OR

2. A Chinese Da Zhuan (or equivalent)

**For students who do not hold a degree-level qualification wholly taught and examined in English, an IELTS score of 4.5 or above or equivalent is required (for example, the NCC Education Standard English Placement Test).*

Qualification Structure

Candidates must pass all core units and any two electives from the options to be awarded the Pre-Master's in Business.
