1. Introduction

All work submitted for an assessment must be the candidate's own work. It is an offence for any candidate to be guilty of, or party to, collusion, plagiarism, misuse of AI or any other act which may mislead examiners and moderators regarding the development and authorship of work presented in assessments. This includes misleading examiners and moderators about the sources of information included in an assessment.

All candidate assignments must be checked using only NCC Education permitted Plagiarism and AI detection software, and the related software report(s) for all Global Assignment Centre Samples must be submitted to NCC Education.

Failure to submit the Plagiarism/AI detection report(s) with candidate work may delay the release of results. As these reports are a mandatory requirement, we cannot issue results until they have been provided and reviewed.

2. Permitted Software

NCC Education currently permits the use of the following Plagiarism and AI detection tools

- Copyleaks (<https://copyleaks.com/>)
- Turnitin (<https://www.turnitin.com/>)

N.B if using Turnitin **two** separate reports must be submitted for each candidate (one for Plagiarism and one for AI detection). For Copyleaks, Plagiarism and AI detection are combined in **one** single report.

3. Usage and Other Software

NCC Education will only permit Centre use of **one** approved software tool from the list above. This means that Partner Centres may use either Turnitin or Copyleaks; but **cannot use both** and cannot submit different software reports for different students.

NCC Education may conduct benchmark testing of other Plagiarism and AI detection tools and will notify Partner Centres should any additional tools be approved for use.

At this time, no other additional tools other than those listed in this document are approved for use.
